- 2. Theoretical basics of Roman marital law: General characteristics of Roman marriage matrimonium iustum and concubinat, Manus; Assumptions for marriage and marriage prohibitions, Augusts marital law, Sponsalia, Marriage, marriage impact on spouses' personal and property relations, dowry (dos), Donatio ante nupitas, Divorce (divortium).
