PURPOSE AND OVERVIEW (max. 5 sentence	es)						

Aims: to acquire general and specific knowledge of Roman law as an unifying factor of Europe (in the educational, doctrinal and practical terms) in order to understand its role in the creation of modern private law; to develop scientific knowledge, on the basis of a centuries-long history of ancient Rome, about the importance of rights and the rule of law, as well as the impact of socio-economic and political situation on the nature of law and legal techniques; to explore sources of Roman law and the institute of the Roman private law, their development, character and some issues of universal significance, as the

basis for the development of modern private law.

SYLLABUS (brief outline and summary of topics, max. 10 sentences)

Term, importance of classification and the system of Roman law. Sources of information and review of legal and ethical principles. Four periods of Roman history: socio-economic and political conditions, social structure, forms of family and property relations, and the overall cultural development. Review and analysis of the legal origin from the Leges regiae and the Law XII tables to Justinian's Corpus iuris civilis; Reception of Roman law (conceptual definition, doctrinal and practical, basic tendencies and Schools of jurisprudence). Institutions of Roman Private Law: Status Law, Family Law, Property Law, Inheritance Law, Contract Law and the Civil court proceedings.
