PURPOSE AND OVERVIEW (max. 5 sentences)

Students are expected to acquire the necessary knowledge and develop relevant skills, abilities and competencies which will enable them to: 1) to develop a systematic approach to legal problems and offer critical and analytical responses related to international police cooperation; 2) to develop the ability to competently and scientifically discuss, research and present the results of their scientific work at scientific conferences and publish their papers in scientific journals; 3) to independently solve practical and theoretical problems in the field of criminal justice and to organize their own scientific research; 4)-to take part in international and national research projects; 5) to keep up with the contemporary development in legal theory and practice, and to put the acquired knowledge into practice, especially in respect of exercising the fundamental principles of the rule of law.

International cooperation in counteracting crime: the legal basis, objectives and forms of cooperation. International police relations: definition, subject and content. International police relations: principles, characteristics, resources and legal entities. Intergovernmental organizations: cooperation within the UN and regional cooperation. Organisation and forms of European cooperation in the field of internal security. INTERPOL - historical development; structure, authorities and forms of work (National Central Bureaus); INTERPOL and Serbia. EUROPOL - the normative aspect, establishment, jurisdiction and organization; EUROPOL authorities and

personnel. Other regional police organization (OAS, SEPICA, SECI Center); ICITAP and CARIN. The Schengen Agreement (control over persons, manhunt) and the Schengen Information System. The European Union and the Lisbon Treaty. International agreements on the exchange of intelligence information in combating against transnational crime. The Bureau for International Cooperation and European Integration of the Serbian Ministry of the Interior. Association of Chiefs of Police. The idea of creating the Balkanpol.
