## PURPOSE AND OVERVIEW (max. 5 sentences)

The course aims to improve students' scientific knowledge and theoretical concepts, to develop academic skills necessary for further academic research in the field of police law as well as specific professional skills for recognizing and classifying specific legal solutions in the area of police law, and to acquire the basic and in-depth knowledge of the police law at the national and international level.

On completion of the course, students will acquire knowledge, skills, abilities and competencies which will enable them to: 1) independently solve practical and theoretical problems in the field of police law, and to organize developmental and scientific research; 2) to take part in scientific research projects; 3) to understand and use the most advanced knowledge in the field of police law; 4) to think critically, act creatively and independently; 5) to competently communicate on a professional level in the dissemination of research results; 6) to present the results at scientific conferences and publish their papers in scientific journals; 7) to contribute to the development of scientific discipline and science in general.

## SYLLABUS (brief outline and summary of topics, max. 10 sentences)

The concept of the police. The origin and historical development of the police. Sources of police law. Types of police. The organization of the police in the Serbian law and comparative law. Organization of police work, conditions and manner of their performance. Police powers. Repressive measures. Use of technology in policing. The responsibility of police

officers. Labour relations in the police. Security services - positive law. Political police in comparative law. Historical development of the political police in Serbia. Control over the police activities. The National Security Council.
